

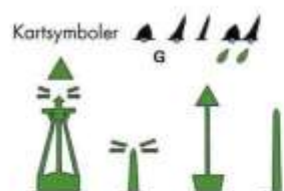
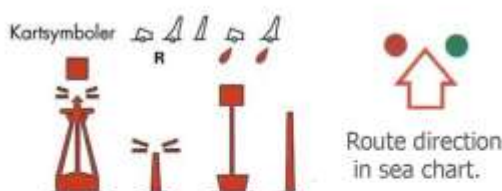

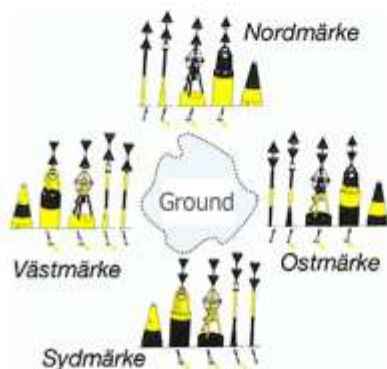
Before you sail away, we leave some important information that may be useful to know.

Dark blue area - 0 - 3 meter deep. take care. drive very slow < 1kn.

Light blue area 3-6 m deep.

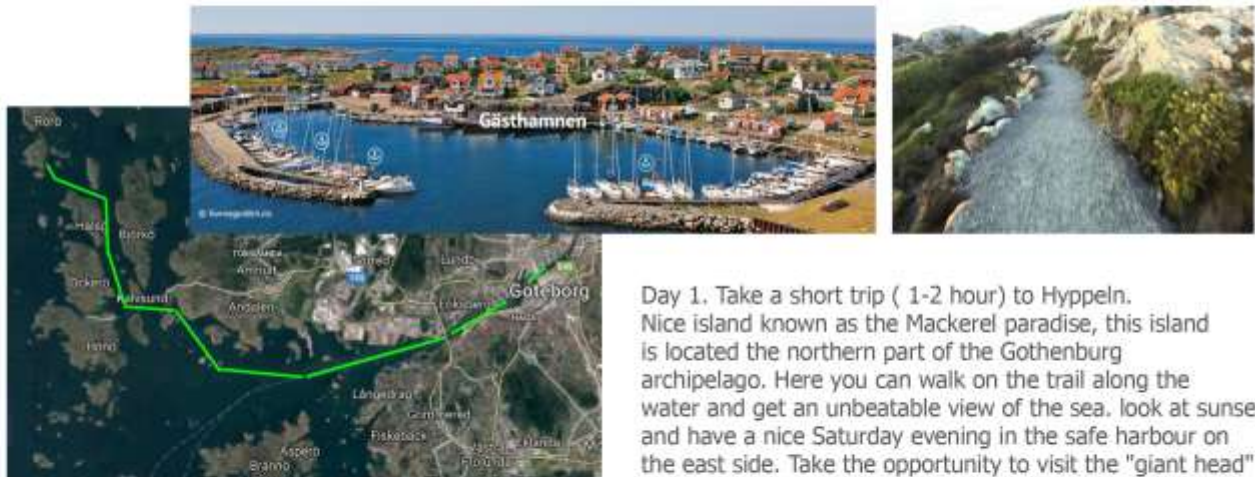
white area - 6 m and deeper.

Use your GPS, but dont trust it to 100%. You have to use your sea chart to.

Some area have no signs so you have to look att the color ahead.



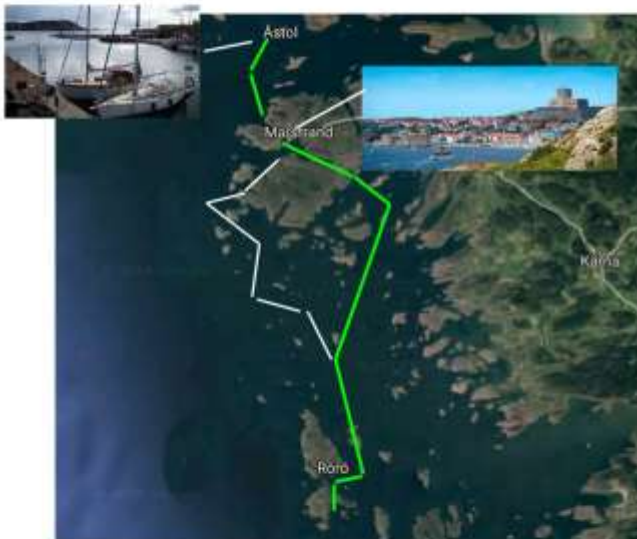
This is a soft route with windy weather options. Sailing on the inside Tjörn and Orust are considerably calmer. The area between Tjörn and Orust is called Stigfjorden. The bridge name between the islands is Skåpesund Bridge and it is high enough for all our boats. Inside the Stigfjord there are several islands where you can anchor for the night. Do not forget to check winds.



Day 1. Take a short trip (1-2 hour) to Hyppeln. Nice island known as the Mackerel paradise, this island is located the northern part of the Gothenburg archipelago. Here you can walk on the trail along the water and get an unbeatable view of the sea. look at sunset and have a nice Saturday evening in the safe harbour on the east side. Take the opportunity to visit the "giant head"

which is a high steep hill where you get a nice view of the Carlsens Fortress on Marstrand. Hyppeln have a restaurant in the harbour. If you want party and pubs-sail directly to Marstrand. Takes 2 hour from Hyppeln.

Day 2. Marstrand - In the far west, where the archipelago ends and the open sea begins, you find the island of Marstrand with Carlsens Fortress at the top. Marstrand is the sailing metropolis of the west coast. The picturesque and beautiful island is a yearly base for the Marstrand Regatta, Match Cup Sweden and other major sailing championships.

A large guest harbour, excellent shops, exciting nightlife and entertainment for the entire family.

The sailing town and seaside resort Marstrand is a favourite with visitors. It is home to a harbour filled with all kinds of boats, cosy homes along car-free streets, top restaurants and cafés, sun and salty swims, music and spectacle.

If you want to take it easy or if its to many boats there- go to the nice island Åstol. Takes about 40 min.

You enter the harbour on the east side.

Take Green route though Albrektsunds channel if its windy or white line if u want to enter from ocean.

Day 3. If you sail from Åstol or Marstrand you have to choices depends on weather. If it's blows too much you can go inside the big island Tjörn and Orust, but it's a nice route anyway. Between this to island you have a big inside lake with lot of small island for nice sun set nature moorings. The name is Stigfjorden and you can go out to ocean if you want.

Inside route is white line and you can visit this place for harbours.

1. Stenunsund. smaller town with Systembolag shops etc. 18 nm.
2. Uddevalla. Quite big town in the end of the Fjord. 30 nm.
3. Henån. Nice small town with shops and restaurant. 35 nm
4. Ellös. Small harbour. Here they build Hallberg Rassy and they have some few nice restaurants. 45 nm
5. Gullholmen. Nice fishing village with shops and restaurants. 48 nm.

Green line. Outside. Sail up to Kärringön 6 or visit Gullhomen 5. Yellow line you can sail in or out in Stigfjorden below.

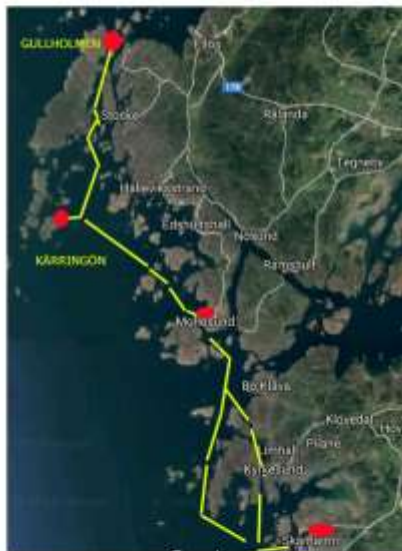

Dag 4. Sail up to the city Lysekil. There are guest ports on the west and eastern sides. Lysekil is a city and there is everything for those who need to replenish the stores. In the afternoon you can sail up to Smögen or sail into the quiet Gullmarsfjord. Stora Bornö is an island in the Gullmarsfjord. Stora Bornö is about four kilometers long from north to south and is mostly covered with wood. The island's highest point is 110 meters above sea level and in many places there are vertical slopes down to the sea.

Day 5. If you have visited Gullmarn or Smögen it's time to turn South. Gullholmen or Kärringön is a good choice for the night. Take a lunch brake in Gullholmen and sail down to Kärringön for the night. Here they have a popular restaurant - name Petterssons krog. If you visit this place on the way up you can visit Skärhamn or Mollösund. .

Day 6. Time for a fairly long sailing down towards Gothenburg. If you need to sailing fast you can sailing down outside the archipelago down to Vinga. You need to be back in the marina before 10:00 am Saturday morning. Most boats comes in on friday night. If you want to finish the last evening i in Gothenburg you can visit Lilla Bommens guest harbor behind the opera house. Next day it takes only 20 minute to our marina.



Lilla Bommen Guestharbor just outside the bridge Gota alvbron. Bridge open if you call on VHF radio channel no 9. All time at weekends. The bridge is closed Monday to Friday between 6-9 am and 3-6 pm.
